Every year, at the beginning of April (at the closure of the skating season) Jesenice and Kranjska Gora become the scene for the competition of the best young figure skaters from all over the world. This year is going to be organised for the 22nd time.

The competition is hosted in Jesenice ice hall Podmežakla and has its roots from the year 1992. From then on it has grown to be one of the most important events in the framework of International Ice skating Union. It is rated immediately after senior and junior world championships.


Over 100 skaters (cadets, juniors and seniors) from all over the world compete for the Triglav Trophy every year. The competition is regularly attended by all important ice skating world powers (such us USA, Japan, Korea, Russia, Canada and all the European countries) with their young promising ice skaters.

Some of the biggest names of world ice skating have competed at the Jesenice ice ring. Many of them became important competitors later, in junior and senior classes, some of them European and World champions and even Olympic winners: Shizuka Arakawa, Stephane Lambiel, Yuna Kim, EvanLysacek, Rachael Flatt,...

Shizuka Arakawa (JPN) won the competition at Jesenice as young girl (junior class) in the year 1996. In the year 2004 she became World champion and two years later in Torino she won the Olympic gold medal.

The winner of the Triglav Trophy 2002 in the junior competition - Evan Lysacek (USA) became the world champion in the year 2009 and the winner in the Olympic games in 2010.

Stephane Lambiel from Switzerland won the gold medal in the Triglav Trophy as a junior in the year 1997. After that, he became world champion twice - in the year 2005 and 2006. In the Olympic Games in Torino (2006) he won silver medal.




The world junior champion in the year 2008 and American state champion in 2010, Rachael Flatt, won gold in Jesenice in 2005.

Yuna Kim, from Korea, together with Mao Asada (JPN) are among of the best worlds skaters. Yuna Kim was the World champion in 2009, she also won Olympic gold in 2010. In Jesenice she competed and won gold in 2002.

In the past few years, senior class competition has been included in the Triglav Trophy program, and more and more of elite skaters from this category come to compete in Jesenice. In the year 2009 the winner of this category was Alban Préaubert, who is also five times winner of the french bronze medal.

Among all this glittering names Slovenia also has its own hero. His name is Gregor Urbas, and on his home ice he won six gold medals. He comes from Jesenice and he is the best Slovenian skater of all time. In the year 2007 he was 9th at the European championship, and this is the best Slovene result in the international championship of this sport.
